



<b>Impact of Action</b>	<b>Degree</b>
Assists the pathologist in the performance of autopsies and processing specimens to meet quality and service requirements. Inadequately prepared bodies may cause emotional discomfort to families. Inadequate storage/disposal of chemicals may cause minor discomfort to other staff.	<u>2.0</u>
<b>Leadership and/or Supervision</b> Provides orientation and functional guidance to co-workers.	<u>1.5</u>
<b>Physical Demands</b> Frequent cumulative physical effort standing and lifting while moving chemicals/supplies, cleaning, and working in awkward positions while assisting with autopsies.	<u>3.0</u>
<b>Sensory Demands</b> Regular sensory effort while assisting with autopsies, mixing solutions, computer operation and listening to instructions from pathologists involving precision work.	<u>2.0</u>
<b>Environment</b> Frequent exposure to major disagreeable conditions such as blood/body fluids, chemicals, infectious disease, sharps, and unpredictable weights.	<u>5.0</u>
