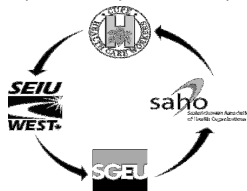

Physical Demands Frequent physical effort with heavy lifting, climbing, bending, pushing, twisting, reaching and stretching. Requires hand-eye coordination to operate equipment such as scrubber, polisher and carts.	<u>3.0</u>
Sensory Demands Occasional sensory effort measuring chemicals, reading labels and documenting work (e.g., cleaning spills and blood/body fluids).	<u>1.0</u>
Environment Regular exposure to major conditions such as blood/body fluids and heavy weights (e.g., moving linen/garbage bags). Frequent exposure to minor conditions such as chemicals, heat, cold, dust and dirt.	<u>4.0</u>
