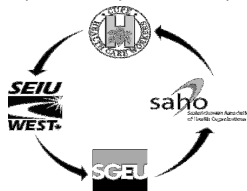

Impact of Action	Degree
Cleans, sterilizes and distributes equipment to meet quality and service requirements. Misjudgement in prioritizing the sterilizing of equipment may result in shortage of supplies resulting in delays in services. Misjudgement in disassembly/assembly may result in damage to expensive equipment.	<u>2.0</u>
Leadership and/or Supervision May show others how to perform tasks or duties by familiarizing new employees with the work area and processes.	<u>1.0</u>
Physical Demands Frequent physical effort continually standing, lifting heavy weights, repetitive body motion with accurate hand-eye coordination.	<u>3.0</u>
Sensory Demands Frequent sensory effort checking instruments and expiry dates, assembling trays and inspecting linen wraps.	<u>3.0</u>
Environment Regular exposure to major disagreeable conditions such as sharps, chemicals, blood/body fluids, equipment/ supplies requiring decontamination.	<u>4.0</u>
