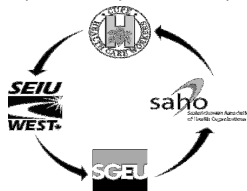

Leadership and/or Supervision May show others how to perform tasks or duties by familiarizing new employees with the work area and processes.	<u>1.0</u>
Physical Demands Frequent cumulative physical effort including standing, crouching, pushing and pulling with periods of heavy lifting.	<u>3.0</u>
Sensory Demands Occasional sensory effort such as visual awareness when ensuring proper labelling and sorting of waste, using compactors, and moving equipment.	<u>1.0</u>
Environment Regular major disagreeable conditions such as blood/body fluids, chemicals, extreme noise, sharps and unpredictable weights (e.g., garbage bags).	<u>4.0</u>
